Holy Trinity is Online

Earlier this year, we launched a new website, www.holytrinityclearview.com

The goal of an online presence is twofold: to give existing parishioners a digital place for fellowship, and to give potential parishioners information about our church. You will find on our website a current calendar of events, photographs of parish events, and a downloads section, where you can retrieve meeting minutes and other documents. We've also re-launched our Facebook site, www.facebook.com/holytrinityclearview, which we hope to be a hub for discussion, and to

promote our parish events to the community. We've also created a logo, which incorporates an artistic rendition of the front of our church building. Standing behind our church is the blue dove from the Diocese of Toronto's logo, surrounded by the heraldic shield of the Anglican Church of Canada. You may have noticed that our promotional parish event posters have our logo, as well as a strange pixilated square on the bottom. This square is called a QR code, which allows smartphones to connect to our website for more information about the



event. You can try scanning the code above, with your smartphone, to connect to our website. To date, our online presence seems to be successful- some attendees of our recent pancake supper found out about the event exclusively through Facebook. Closing Celebration Services

On Sunday, April 8th, a closing celebration service was held at Christ Church, Batteaux, presided by Bishop Peter Fenty. The liturgy was well attended, and Bishop Fenty conveyed in his message that the closure of the church building is not the

end of the Parish and its work; rather, the Church is not a building, but its people. The annual Bishop's visit followed at Holy Trinity Clearview, with a lunch after the liturgy. The closing celebration service at St. Paul's,

Singhampton has been postponed. The St. Paul's building is currently not safe to enter due to mould; the future of the building is in the hands of Bishop Fenty and David Badian, the director of property resources.
